  - Adding Suffixes to Phonetic Skills 1 and 2, Lesson 28: Students will learn that a suffix is one or more letters added to the end of a word, changing the meaning of the word and usually its part of speech.
  - <u>Decoding Skill 1, Lesson 39:</u> Students will decode two-syllable words following the patterns to determine how many syllables are in a printed word, and the correct vowel sound for each syllable.
  - <u>Last Job for Y, Lesson 41:</u> Students will decode multi-syllable words ending in the spelling of 'y' where 'y' is a working vowel and has the sound of long 'e'.
  - <u>Decoding Skill 2, Lesson 42:</u> Students will decode two-syllable words following the patterns to determine how many syllables are in a printed word, and the correct vowel sound for each syllable.
  - <u>Prefixes, Lesson 43:</u> Students will learn a prefix is one or more letters added to the beginning of a word that changes the meaning of the word.
  - <u>Decoding Any Length Word, Lesson 45:</u> Students will learn to decode any length word using both Decoding Skills 1 and 2.
  - Other Suffixes, Lesson 58: Students will learn that a suffix is one or more letters



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added to the end of a word, changing the meaning of the word and usually its part of speech. **ESOL Supplement – Suffixes** p. 708

- Adding Suffixes to Words Ending in Y, Lesson 59: Students will practice adding s, -ed, -es, -er, -est, -ing, and -ly to base words ending in the spelling of 'y'.
- Practicing Multi-syllabic Words, Lesson 60: Students will practice decoding multi-syllabic words containing 'y' as a vowel, Silent E, Adjacent Vowels, Digraphs, and Special Vowel Sounds (diphthongs).
- <u>Decoding Exceptions, Lesson 61:</u> Students will practice decoding multi-syllabic words that do not follow Decoding Skill 2.
- Letter Combinations that Split, Lesson 63: Students will decode multi-syllabic words in which some letter combinations are not usually split for syllabication.
- <u>Vowels That Reverse. Lesson 66:</u> Students will learn to decode words containing irregular vowel spellings.
- Other Sounds of EA and IE, Lesson 67:
  Students will learn other vowel sounds and spellings for the vowel combinations 'ea' and 'ie'. Student.
- Synonyms, Antonyms, and More, Lesson 68: Students will learn the meanings of the grammar terms: synonyms, antonyms, homonyms, homophones, heteronyms, and palindromes.
